

- Title: 2022 GW Institute for Korean Studies Summer Study Abroad Program, "Korea in the 21st Century: Past, Present, and Future in the Age of Globalization."
- **2. Date:** Sunday, July 31, 2022 Saturday, August 13, 2022
- 3. Location: Seoul, South Korea

4. Description: By visiting various sites in South Korea, we will use the border as a lens into exploring four main themes: Korean identities, culture, division, and reunification. We will treat these themes not as mutually exclusive but constitutive entities. Thus, these four themes will be reflected in readings, discussions, on-site lectures, and site-visits. In addition, the concept of the border will be the prime into the larger political, economic, social, and cultural conditions that enabled its metamorphosis. In particular, we will trace the transnational processes of modernization, imperialism, colonization, the Cold War, decolonization, and neoliberalism that have shaped and continue to shape Korean identity and culture. Our interdisciplinary inquiry draws from history, literature, anthropology, business, media, and performance studies.

04. Pre-Departure

- Make sure to register your K-ETA no later than 72 hours prior to departure. This is your electronic travel authorization for Korea and is required for entry if you do not have a visa. The cost is 10,000 KRW (about \$9). More information is available at https://www.k-eta.go.kr/portal/apply/index.do
 - a. Make sure to prepare a profile photo in advance in front of a blank background
 - *b.* Use Sean Dolan's phone number for your phone number in Korea if needed (*redacted from publc itinerary*)
- Register your COVID test information with Q-Code. This is required for your entry into Korea: <u>https://cov19ent.kdca.go.kr/cpassportal/biz/beffatstmnt/main.do?lang=en</u>
 - a. A Video Guide can be found here: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=s0m9v8J8_dA</u>
 - b. Upload your Negative COVID-19 test results to the app
 - i. Antigen Tests are valid if taken up to the day before your departure. [Must be administered at healthcare facility. Self-tests are NOT accepted]
 - ii. PCR tests are accepted up to two days in advance of your departure
 - iii. (Example) If you are departing from the US to Korea on July 30, 2022 at 10:00,
 - you must submit your negative PCR test result taken after 00:00 on July 28,
 - 2022 or supervised negative RAT result taken after 00:00 on July 29, 2022.
 - iv. You are no longer required to be submit a vaccine record
 - c. PRINT A HARD COPY of your results
 - i. If you do not have a Korean number for your Q-Code information (please use Sean Dolan's number)
 - ii. Save your QR Code and show it to the immigration officer when going through customs
- <u>Download the KakaoTalk App</u> and send your ID to Sean Dolan ; you will be added to our group chat
- Download the Naver Maps app to help you navigate around Seoul. *Note Google Maps does not work well in Korea, Naver Maps is much more reliable*. The "KakaoMetro" app is recommended for for navigating the subway

- Call your cell phone company to get an international plan for your phone. Alternatively, you can get a short-term Korean SIM card at the airport in Seoul or have one delivered to you in the US. Make sure your phone is unlocked. There are several options for cell phone plans that can be reserved in advance including the options below. Make sure that you select the correct terminal for pick-up.
 - a. KR SIM Website (Pick-up at Airport)
 - b. Trazy (Pick-up at Airport)
 - c. Trazy (Delivery to US)
 - d. KT (Pick-Up at Airport)

05. At the Airport

- Check your arrival terminal in advance here: <u>https://www.airport.kr/ap/en/svc/airlinesTerInfoList.do</u>. If you are flying on Delta or Korean Airlines, you are arriving in Terminal 2. Most other airlines operate from Terminal 1.
- You must get COVID test within one day of arrival. Please be sure to get your test taken at the airport. Te Arrival COVID test at the airport costs 80,000 KRW and can be done upon arrival without an appointment. Please follow the signs at the airport to the testing center. Testing centers are available in Terminal 1 just outside the main terminal near doors 5 and 10. In Terminal 2, testing centers are located inside on the basement level near Gate A and near Gate B:

 - b. If your phone can't receive texts in Korea, please put down Sean Dolan's phone number as the contact number
 - c. Upload the results to Q-Code once you receive them: https://cov19ent.kdca.go.kr/cpassportal/biz/beffatstmnt/registAfterArrival.do
- Get cash from the ATM at the airport so you have Korean currency. Transportation cards can only be loaded with cash.
- Buy a T-Money Card (Transportation Card) at the airport. These cost about 4,000 KRW. You can buy a card from any of the convenience stores in the airport (look for GS 25 or CU). You can load your card as well. We recommend loading at least 20,000 KRW at the airport. You can reload your card later as necessary.




Directions from Incheon Airport to Aventree Hotel


Option 1: Subway

• Take the airport railroad Incheon Airport to Seoul Station

- You can purchase a ticket for the express train (AREX) for 9,500 KRW or take the regular subway (airport railroad line) for 4,750 KRW. The express train takes approximately 51 minutes (from Terminal 2). The all-stop train takes about 1 hour and 10 minutes (from Terminal 2)
- Once you arrive at Seoul station you, can transfer to Subway line number 1 and get off at Jongak Station (two stops). The hotel is about a 5 minute walk from exit 3-1.
- If you have a lot of baggage, it may be difficult to transfer subway lines with all your luggage. Another option is **taking a taxi from Seoul Station to the hotel**. Follow the signs to the taxi stand at Seoul Station and show the driver your hotel address. The taxi ride will last bout 10 minutes and cost should cost about 6,500 KRW.







Option 2: Airport Bus


Note due to COVID-19, the operating frequency of airport buses has been reduced significantly. There are two airport buses (6002 and 6011) that travel near our hotel. Bus tickets cost 16,000 KRW and can be purchased at the bus station located within the airport.

2-1: From the airport, you can take Airport Bus 6002 to Jongo 1-Ga (about a 10 minute walk from the hotel). This bus currently departs 12 times a day. The total travel time is around 2 hours, depending on traffic. Check the most updated schedule at https://www.airport.kr/ap/en/tpt/busRouteList.do



You will give one presentation based on your trip to Seoul. The presentation will be on the last day of your trip to South Korea. You are encouraged to think of how you would like to develop your experience in Korea and explain how you plan to reflect "Korea" in building your career. The presentation can either be a Powerpoint Presentation or a video. The winner of the best presentation will receive \$200.

- Dress code
 - Day 1-3, 13: Casual attire is fine for outside activities and visits to museums.
 - Day 4-12: It is suggested to wear Business Casual.
- Instructions for the DMZ visit (Day 4 | August 3)
 - You must bring a passport on DMZ tour day.
- Weather Forecast

We expect some rain during the program. Please prepare an umbrella and a waterproof rain jacket for outside activities. It is suggested to wear summer attire; it can be very hot and humid. The average temperature is between 22.0°C (71.6°F) to 30.0°C (86.0°F).

- COVID Information
 - Korea has a strictly enforced indoor mask mandate
 - You must wear a mask at all times indoors; masking outdoors is highly recommended
 - Please be sure to bring enough masks to last the duration of your program
 - We recommend bringing some rapid COVID tests with you from home. Tests can also be purchased at local pharmacies for around 5,000 KRW
 - If you test positive for COVID, you are required to quarantine for 7 days at your own expense. The cost for most quarantine facilities is approximately 100,000 KRW (\$90) per day, including meals
 - Please carefully review the pre-departure and airport arrival information sections for COVID testing rules. It is mandatory that you get a test prior to departing for Seoul and upon arrival.
